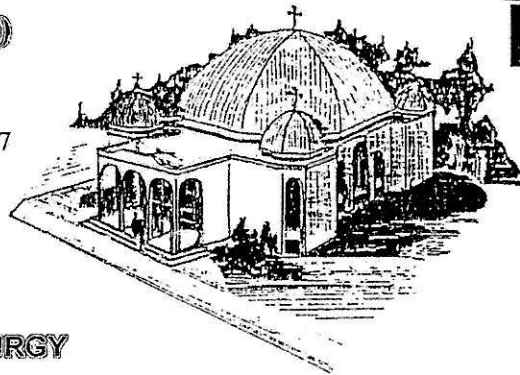

**PARISH ASSEMBLY/SOBOR** – In preparation for our Eparchial Assembly/Sobor each parish is asked to prepare a report on the key aspects in the life of our parish. As a result every registered parishioner is encouraged to fill out the Parish Sobor Questionnaire and leave it in Collection basket no later than February 29, 2020. They do not need to be signed. Parish Council will formulate a draft document that will be presented at the Regional Sobor on March 17 in Thunder Bay.

**The theme of the Patriarchal Sobor in 2020 is: "Emigration, settlements and the global unity of UGCC.**

**“ The main motto is: “The Church is with you always and everywhere.” ... The upcoming session of the Patriarchal Assembly-Sobor aims to broadly analyze the challenges which stand before the global UGCC, and to help us find the best ways to “gather those who have been dispersed,” and to grow in the communion of our autonomous Church. (His Beatitude Sviatoslav, Letter to the Bishops, Oct. 16, 2019) Two key topics:**

- 1. Pastoral outreach beyond the current membership of our Church**
- 2. Communion-unity of our Church at all levels**

- Purpose and goal:**
- 1. To assess and strengthen pastoral outreach and communion/unity in our parishes**
  - 2. To assess and strengthen pastoral outreach and communion/unity within the eparchy (regionally and eparchy-wide)**
  - 3. To prepare for participation in the Patriarchal Assembly/Sobor and assist the Patriarch and Synod in their effort to assess and strengthen pastoral outreach and communion/unity in the UGCC.**

**Two aspects:**

- 1. Analysis (Examination of conscience: strengths, weaknesses, opportunities, and obstacles)**
- 2. Prophetic vision for the future: best practices / proposals / commitment**

**Areas of consideration for our Eparchy:**

- 1. Demographic and social changes that have occurred over the past decades (migration, immigration, generational migration, movement from rural to urban areas, secularization, movement to other denominations, and loss of faith). How have we been affected by these changes and how do we respond?**
- 2. The needs of our faithful on the territory of the Eparchy and whether the existing parishes are sufficient to meet those needs (For reference see: Interactive map of the UGCC, <https://map.ugcc.ua/>) Where are our faithful today and does our Eparchy need to establish any new parishes?**

- 3. Our Church's presence and interaction with the local community (Ukrainian community and Canadian society) in the spirit of the Patriarchal Sobor motto: "The Church is with you always and everywhere!" Does our Church create opportunities for encounter or do we simply expect people to come to us?**
- 4. Our Church's commitment to reach out beyond her current membership (Pastoral Responsibility for our faithful, sense of Evangelization and Mission). Does our Church foster a spirit of invitation and welcome. Is she able to move "from maintenance to mission?"**
- 5. Specific initiatives that strengthen communion/unity at the level of parish / eparchy-region / UGCC. In what ways do we already live and act as a united Christian family? In what ways might we strengthen our sense of communion and unity... in our parishes, in our Eparchy, in our Church as a whole?**
