

A PERSONAL ENCOUNTER

“There came a woman of Samaria to draw water. Jesus said to her, “Give me a drink”. Notice that Jesus doesn't approach the Samaritan woman brandishing a bible and talking of repentance. He just asks for a drink of water. He does not act as superior to her, but as inferior. She has something He needs: water.

The conversation that develops begins in a very informal way, but before it is finished it has covered some of the deepest questions of morals and religion. But the really important thing is not the content of the conversation- significant as that is – as much as the extremely personal encounter that is taking place. This is a real person who has met Jesus, and Jesus gives her his whole attention. She is as real as any of us. And she has met someone unique – one who seems to look right into her depths and knows all about her. “Come and see a man, who has told me

everything I did,` she said to her fellow villagers. She came to know Jesus personally as a result of this tremendous I – Thou encounter she had with Him.

Don` t we all need such a personal encounter with Jesus in order for our faith to grow? Is not this what Jesus offers us today in prayer, in the daily reading of His word, in the Eucharist? He sits at the well which is called prayer or scripture or the Eucharist and waits for us to come to Him so that we may have personal, life-changing encounter with Him. The more personal our encounter with Jesus, the more real our faith becomes.

NO – BAKE CHEESECAKE

Prep time: 20 minutes

Cook time: 6 - 8 minutes

Total time: 8 hours, 28 minutes

GRAHAM CRACKER CRUST

2 cups graham cracker crumbs

1/3 cup packed light or dark brown sugar

1/2 cup (8 tbsp) unsalted butter, melted

CHEESECAKE

1 and 1/4 cups heavy cream or heavy whipping cream

three 8 – ounce blocks of full – fat cream cheese, softened to room temperature

1/2 cup granulated sugar

2 tbsp confectioners' sugar

1/4 cup sour cream, at room temperature

2 tsp lemon juice

1 tsp pure vanilla extract

INSTRUCTIONS

Make the crust: Stir the graham cracker crust ingredients together. Put into a 9 – inch or 10 – inch springform pan and pack very tightly. Use the bottom of a measuring cup to pack it into the bottom and sides. Bake at 350 for 6 – 8 minutes. Let it cool.

Make the filling: Using a hand mixer or stand mixer fitted with a whisk attachment, whip the cold heavy cream into stiff peaks on medium – high speed, about 4 -5 minutes. Set aside.

Using a hand mixer or stand mixer fitted with a whisk or paddle attachment, beat the cream cheese and granulated sugar together on medium speed until perfectly smooth and creamy. Scrape down the sides and bottom of the bowl with a rubber spatula as needed. Add the confectioners' sugar, sour cream, lemon juice and vanilla extract. Beat for 2 – 3 minutes on medium – high speed until smooth and combined. Make sure there are no lumps of cream cheese. If there are, keep beating until smooth.

Using your mixer on low speed or a rubber spatula, fold the whipped cream into the cheesecake filling until combined. Combine slowly as you don't want to deflate all the air in the whipped cream.

Spread filling into the crust. Smooth down the top. Use an offset spatula if available.

Cover tightly with plastic wrap or aluminum foil and refrigerate for at least 6 - 8 hours and up to 2 days.

Use a knife to loosen the chilled cheesecake from the rim of the springform pan, then remove the rim. Use a clean sharp knife, cut into slices for serving.

Serve cheesecake with desired topping.

Blueberry/Blackberry Compote Topping

2 cups frozen or fresh berries
2 tbsp white granulated sugar
2 tbsp lemon juice
1 tsp lemon zest

Mix all ingredients together in a medium saucepan.

Bring to a simmer over low heat, stirring. Let it continue to simmer, stirring every so often for about 10 minutes until the juice has thickened slightly. It will thicken further as it cools.
