

## ANNOUNCEMENTS:

1. Ladies and Men of the parish are asked to help make perogies and cabbage rolls on Thursday November 11th, 2021 at 7:00 a.m. Preparation work (cabbage & potatoes) is completed by the cook. There will be social distancing at the tables.

3. The Nativity Fast, commonly known as Pylypivka by Ukrainians, begins on Monday, November 15<sup>th</sup>. It is a 40-day time of prayer, fasting, and alms giving—a 'Little Lent' in preparation for the 'Winter Pascha', Christmas. 4. The weekly Rosary and Divine Liturgy is being moved from Monday in order to allow Fr. Michael to have a full day every week for rest and family time, barring emergency or a major feast day service. The proposal: move it from Monday at noon to Wednesday at noon. Other suggestions welcome!

## **OUR FIRST RECIPE!!!!**

### **MEAT PIE (1 pie, double recipe for 2)**

**1 lb ground meat (pork, veal, & beef). Pino’s have them altogether in 1 package.**

**1 small diced onion**

**1/2 tsp salt, pepper (add more if needed)**

**1 tsp ground cloves (add more if needed)**

1/2 tsp garlic powder (add more if needed)

Brown meat and drain off the fat. Saute onion and add to cooked mixture. Add salt, pepper, cloves and garlic powder.

Add about 1 cup of water and let simmer for 20 minutes. Thicken with 1/2 tsp of cornstarch and again more if needed.

Put mixture into a pie shell and cover with top crust.

Bake in 350 oven for half an hour.
