

A note from Fr. Michael:

On March 25, a new Ukrainian translation of the Divine Liturgy came into effect. As of April 24, we have not received any

hard copies of this text, either in the form of the priest's service book or pew books for the faithful. However, it is available online. Until we have the resources needed to begin the process of fully moving to this new translation, I ask that the people continue using the texts in the current pew books for the non-changing parts of the Liturgy. I will be starting to use the new translation from the altar wherever possible. You will notice some differences between what the pew books say and what I say at the altar—this is simply me starting to use and get used to the new translation. I am making up nothing!
