#### TODAYS FEAST: ALL SAINTS OF RUS'-UKRAINE

Today we celebrate the memory of the astonishing and holy people which the Holy Spirit produced on the lands of Rus'-Ukraine. The Church shows us these extraordinary people - key people - who are nonetheless ordinary people, like us. They are extraordinary because despite all their weaknesses, their mistakes and their sins they always kept on moving towards the highest of callings with faith and faithfulness, with humility and confidence. They hesitated. They often fell down along the way. They were sometimes full of anguish, doubt and pain. But they always ended by getting up again and pushing on towards the light and the truth, towards love and goodness. Thus they were also very ordinary people - like us. By honoring the saints we honor God, for respect shown to them is respect shown to God. The saints did not become saints through their own power; their holiness is the result of God's grace. All they are they owe to God.

Your martyrs' blood testifies before heaven and earth to your unwavering faith in God. You are our powerful intercessors before the throne of the Most High. Therefore, with the Mother of God, implore the heavenly Father, the Saviour Jesus Christ, and the Holy Spirit, the Comforter, a continuous blessing upon our Church and nation, so that they could joyfully and freely glorify your holy names.

Once a group of 500 people was attending a seminar. Suddenly the speaker stopped and decided to do a group activity.

At the end of 5 minutes, no one could find their own balloon.

Then, the speaker asked each person to randomly collect a balloon and give it to the person whose name was on it. Within minutes everyone had their own balloon.

The speaker then began, "This is happening in our lives. Everyone is frantically looking for happiness all around, not knowing where it is."

Our happiness lies in the happiness of other people. Give them their happiness; you will get your own happiness. And this is the purpose of human life...the pursuit of happiness."

There was an old man who lived in a forest. As he grew older and older, he started losing his hair, until one day, on his deathbed, he was completely bald. That day, he called his children to a meeting...He said, "Look at my hair. It used to be so magnificent, but it's completely gone now. My hair can't be saved. But look outside at the forest. It's such a lovely forest with so many trees, but sooner or later they'll all be cut down and this forest will look as bald as my hair."

"What I want you to do..." the man continued. "Is every time a tree is cut own or dies, plant a new one in my memory. Tell your descendants to do the same. It shall be our family's duty to keep this forest strong." And so they did.

Each time the forest lost a tree, the children replanted one, and so did their children, and their children after them. And for centuries, the forest remained as lush and as pretty as it once was, all because of one man and his reseeding hairline.

If you get to church early you may notice the priest spending a lot of time in the sanctuary in the corner. Ever wondered...what's Father doing back there?

The Liturgy actually begins some time before the posted start time—the priest says entrance prayers in front of the Holy Doors, puts on the vestments, and then performs an elaborate ritual called 'Proskomedia' or 'Prothesis'. It is during this ritual that he prepares the bread and the wine for the Divine Liturgy. The photo shows the end result.

So what happens during the Proskomedia?

The rite calls for five special loves, or prosphora, to be used. Each loaf, or prosphoron, is stamped with the markings "IC XC NIKA", meaning 'Jesus Christ is victorious'. These five loaves are all used for a different part

of the rite.

The large cube in the centre of the diskos is called the 'Lamb' and is cut from the first prosphoron. This represents Christ and Holy Communion is distributed from this piece alone.

The rest of the pieces, or particles, are triangles. To the right of the Lamb (or the viewer's left), the particle represents the Mother of God—the Queen of Heaven and Earth. This piece is cut from the second prosphoron.

To the left of the Lamb (the viewer's right) there are nine particles, representing different categories of saints: the Angles, Prophets, Apostles, Hierarchs, Martyrs, Venerable Ones, Unmercenary Healers, the Ancestors of God, and, finally, all the saints. These nine particles are cut from the third prosphoron.

Underneath the lamb are two rows of particles. The first row is for the living and the second row is for the dead. These are for all of the intentions at a particular Liturgy--the priest's own intentions and those of others. These two rows are cut from the fourth and fifth prosphora respectively.

Finally, in this case, there are two more Lambs prepared above the large Lamb in the centre. This photo was taken during Lent when the Liturgy of the Presanctified Gifts is offered on weekdays. Those two Lambs are consecrated at the Sunday Liturgy and will be distributed at Holy Communion during the Presanctified Liturgies in the upcoming week. These are cut from a sixth and seventh prosphora. Outside of Lent, you would not have these additional Lambs.

Each cut of the bread is accompanied by prayers. Once the diskos and chalice are prepared, they are veiled and blessed with incense as final prayers are offered before the beginning of the public Divine Liturgy. In this ritual, the Lord Jesus Christ, His Mother, the Saints, the living and the dead are all brought together and offered on the altar to the Father.

What about all the leftover bread from this? That's what Father distributes to the people after the Liturgy.

So what is Father doing back there? Now you know!
