Every sunrise leaves us with one day less. If you can't be the pencil that writes joy, be the eraser that eases someone's sorrow, restores hope, and reminds them:



Prayer Intentions, Special Services, and Stipends

I've had questions about how Liturgy intentions work, what the fee to request an intention is, how funeral, wedding, or baptism costs work, etc.... I'll address this here all in one place and I hope to make it as clear and as transparent as possible. If you still have questions, please feel free to ask!

First of all, <u>there is never any fee or required payment of any kind</u> for a prayer/Liturgy intention or special service (baptism, wedding, funeral, memorial service, etc...). The Church offers her prayer and rites and the sacraments freely. To require payment would be to commit the sin of simony. Nevertheless, very often, the faithful want to offer a stipend, a monetary 'thank you', for such intentions or occasions. This is optional and never expected (though always appreciated).

Liturgy Intentions

There is no limit to the number of intentions at a Liturgy, however **a priest can receive a maximum of one stipend** per Liturgy (for a 'primary intention'). Furthermore, on every Sunday and Holy Day of Obligation, the primary intention must be for the members of the parish and no stipend can be received for that Liturgy. If there are multiple Liturgies in a parish on those days, at least one of them must be for parishioners.

A Complicating Situation

Suppose there is already a primary or 'stipended' intention at a Liturgy and the priest is given a stipend for an additional intention.

Option 1: The priest offers another Liturgy at another time for the intention attached to that additional stipend.

Option 2: The priest passes on the intention and stipend to another priest. This may be a concelebrating priest at the same Liturgy or a priest celebrating the Liturgy at another time.

These rules exist in order to prevent priests from collecting large numbers of stipends per Liturgy and unfairly profiting off of the faithful's devotion. This abuse sadly has happened.

As for the amount given, our Eparchy does not have a published list of suggested stipends. In my experience, most give between \$10 and \$30. Most Catholic jurisdictions I'm aware of with officially suggested stipends will indicate \$10 or \$20.

Special Services

Funerals – In our Eparchy, the suggested stipend amount is \$350 for the priest and \$150 for the cantor. These stipends are usually collected by the funeral home as a part of their fees and then they issue the cheques to the recipients. Something to consider: if you offer the priest and cantor a stipend personally, you don't get charged HST. If done through the funeral home, they charge HST. Again, these are never required.


Weddings/Baptisms/Memorial Services – There is no suggested amount for these in our Eparchy. However, when I am asked about what is reasonable, I mention the funeral amount and the time requirements of a funeral vs the time requirements of the service being requested. For a memorial parastas or panakhyda, I would suggest much less (usually \$20). For a wedding or a baptism, a bit more than a funeral since they require a greater time commitment from the priest. And then always reiterate that the services are offered for no charge and that any money offered is a free-will stipend. If I am not asked about a stipend, I do not bring it up.
