Why Two Water Blessings?

Our parish has for many years offered the Great Blessing of Water on the Sunday after Theophany followed by the communal meal. You will have noticed that there is another water blessing being offered on Monday, January 5th—the eve of Theophany.

Why?

There are two main reasons. First, the Church appoints two water blessings at Theophany. The first blessing is on the eve of the Feast and the second is on the day of the Feast, though this second blessing is often transferred to the following Sunday in parish practice (like in our parish). By offering the first water blessing on Theophany Eve, we are moving towards a more complete observance of this great and holy Feast.

The second reason is more practical. The feast is on Tuesday and the main parish water blessing is on Sunday. That leaves nearly a whole week of the feast of Theophany without Theophany water! By having the first water blessing on Monday evening when the Church calls for it, the parish has Jordan water to be taken home by the faithful or used in house blessings for the whole of the feast.

Given personnel available, the water blessing on Monday evening will be slightly toned down compared to the complete rite to be taken the following Sunday, but the whole (and incredibly beautiful) blessing prayer will be offered.

Dear Friends and [Parishioners:

As we welcome in this New Year, we have a wonderful opportunity to look forward, rather than behind us, and to commit ourselves to drawing even closer in our relationship with Christ. Our world is still in pain. Our brothers and sisters in Ukraine still suffer oppression. Our brothers and sisters in much of Israel and the Middle East wake up to bombing, destruction and death daily, and many throughout the world are still experiencing conflict. In our own communities we witness homelessness, poverty, domestic violence and much confusion. Amid all this darkness there is a light. We proclaimed Christmas Eve "The Light of Christ has come into the world", and "God is with us". This New Year may you seek that light in your own lives. The light of God's love which, when we allow it to shine in us, brings to the world hope and peace. There are many this year who will be facing challenges, loss and at times a sense of desperation and hopelessness. It is in these times that the light of Christ helps to give us perspective in all our situations. For where Christ is, even during turmoil, there is peace. We know that we are not alone, and that God is always with us to share in our joys and sorrows. Look around and see Him in those around you; those pick up the phone and call to give encouragement, or to see how you are doing. Those, who take the time to come and visit and share themselves and their time with you. Those, whom we see in our communities reaching out to those in need. This is really the goodness that permeates our world. The light is stronger than the darkness. Love always trumps hate. We are a "new creation in Christ", by virtue of our Baptism we have died with Him that we might rise with Him. As God's children we do not give into despair, we do not allow others negativity to have power over us...we believe that "all things work out for good for those who love God" as Paul tells us in his letter to the Romans.

In this New Year my prayer for you is simple:
