## **HAPPY FATHER'S DAY**

To all the fathers, grandfathers, fathers-to-be, Godfathers, spiritual fathers and my-other-father fathers – we thank the Lord for each and everyone of you and ask He you and keep you in His care.

### **THE BRIDGE HE BUILT**

Ethan grew up in a small town where the river split the land in two. On one side was the bustling main street, on the other the quiet neighbourhood where his family lived. The only way to cross was an old wooden bridge, weathered and creaking, much like his father's hands after years of carpentry.

His father, Daniel, was a man of few words, but endless patience. He never lectured; instead, he taught through the rhythm of his work – measuring twice, cut once, and never rushing what mattered. Ethan, restless and eager to leave the small town, often found his father's pace frustrating.

One summer, a storm tore through the valley and the old bridge collapsed into the churning river. The town council debated for weeks about rebuilding, but Daniel didn't wait. He gathered his tools, salvaged the wood he could, and began working alone. Ethan watched from the porch, arms crossed, convinced it was a pointless effort.

But the day after, Daniel returned to the riverbank. He worked in the heat, the drizzle and under the pale of dawn. Slowly the skeleton of a new bridge took shape. One evening, Ethan finally asked, "Why do you keep doing this? It's not your job."

Daniel paused, resting his hands on the railing just sanded. "Son, sometimes you don't build things because t's your job. You build them because some will need to cross."

The words settled into Ethan's chest like a seed. He picked up a hammer the next morning and worked beside his father. By the end of the summer, the bridge stood strong, its planks smooth and sturdy underfoot.

Years, later, when Ethan returned to visit, he saw children racing across that same bridge, their laughter echoing over the water. He realized his father built a way across the river – he'd built a lesson Ethan would carry forever: that the quiet work of love often outlasts the hands that made it.

And in that moment, Ethan understood that his father's greatest legacy wasn't the bridge itself, but the space it created for others to move forward.

### **NOW ON A LIGHTER NOTE...**

I turned 18 when I was a senior in high school, and my dad was one of the counselors at the school. Because his life's work was ushering teens into adulthood, he was very big on helping his own daughters grow into functional adults, too. So, after I turned 18, he told me that as an adult, if I missed school due to illness, I'd have to write my own excuse since I was now responsible for myself – not my parents.

I missed a day due to illness shortly after my 18th birthday, wrote my own excuse, and took it to the attendance lady. She was not amused and made a HUGE deal out of it, eventually even calling my dad down to the office when I told her that he was the one who told me I needed to write my own note. She threatened to send me to the principle's office, but my dad backed me up firmly said I was an adult, so he couldn't write my excuses for me anymore – I had to do it.

A few months later, I got some kind of virus that made me super sick, and I actually missed an entire week of school because I was so ill. On the day I was to go back, I begged my dad to write an excuse for me because the last time I had written my own was such a huge ordeal. At first my dad refused, but finally he said, "Oh...okay, I'll do it if it means that much to you." So, he scribbled a note on a piece of paper, folded it up, and handed it to me.

At the attendance office, I handed over the note. The attendance lady opened it, read the note, looked at me, and said, "Do you think this is funny?" I had no idea what she was talking about. She handed me the note. My dad signed it Sir John A. MacDonald.
